




What has Maersk done?

- Where and how is Maersk causing, contributing or being linked to severe human rights impacts?






What has Maersk done? Results

Issues that are complex and systemic


Ex. Ship-building Ex: Ship-breaking; Ex. Cargo due diligence in West Africa, Asia and conflict-affected areas
