- Ageing population 70+ living longer
- Rising public expectations
 - individual patient focus
 - emphasis on quality
- Rising costs



PPP in Public Health Sector



- Primary focus is the patient, aiming at:
 - √ promoting efficiency,
 - √ improving the quality of services rendered, and
 - ✓ stimulating fresh flows of investments
- Quest to improve value for money of the taxpayer and stimulate economic growth
- Ministry of Health forefront of changes
- Policies competitive tendering market testing large scale investments



PPP in Public Health Sector



- Implementing PPP takes:
 - time,
 - effort and
 - innovative thinking.

But experience elsewhere shows that:

- well researched,
- well planned, and
- well implemented projects, provide real benefits for all stakeholders involved, but mostly, for the community we serve.



PPP in Public Health Sector





- Delivery of upgraded quality of services according to Ministry of Health needs & standards
- Timetable for bringing a new hospital into operation is considerably faster than most publicly financed hospitals (conventional method experience shows that about 80% of the projects are off-budget and off-time)
- Innovative design
- Allows Ministry of Health to concentrate on delivering medical & clinical services
- Value for money for the taxpayer confirmed

The Greek Choice






- Medical & clinical services shall not be included

- Staffing by the Ministry of Health
- Supply, maintenance and upgrading of medical and technical equipment by the private sector
- Infrastructure, accommodation services and facility management by the private sector

- the facility management
- the provision of accommodation services

Result:

- provision of medical & clinical services in a better environment focusing on patients' needs
- change of the image of the National Health System (ESY)
- Long term benefits for both the patients and the State

At this moment, the Ministry of Health and Social Solidarity is implementing 4 new projects by the PPP method.

These fully equipped establishments will provide a wide range of medical services - specialized and general - in order to meet patients' needs.

- Paediatric Hospital in Thessaloniki (Budget-NPV: 389 M euros Surface: 54,000m2 Capacity: 400 beds Contracting Authority: DEPANOM S.A.)
- Oncological Hospital in Thessaloniki (Budget-NPV: 396 M euros Surface: 54,000m2 Capacity: 400 beds Contracting Authority: DEPANOM S.A.)
- New General Hospital in Preveza (Budget-NPV: 131 M euros Surface: 18,000m2 Capacity: 164 beds Contracting Authority: DEPANOM S.A.)
- Rehabilitation & Recovery Center of Northern Greece (Budget-NPV: 124 M euros Surface: 18,000m2 Capacity: 250 beds Contracting Authority: Health Units AEMY S.A.)
